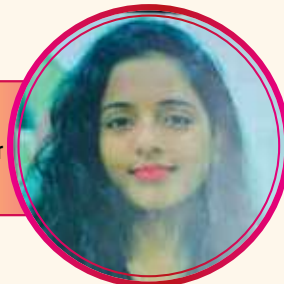

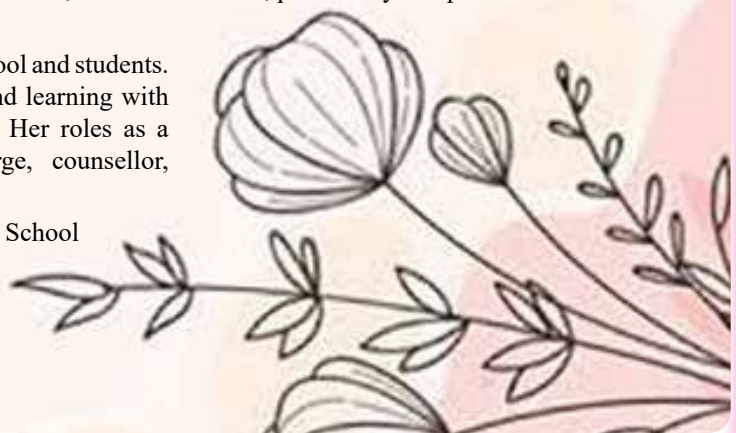

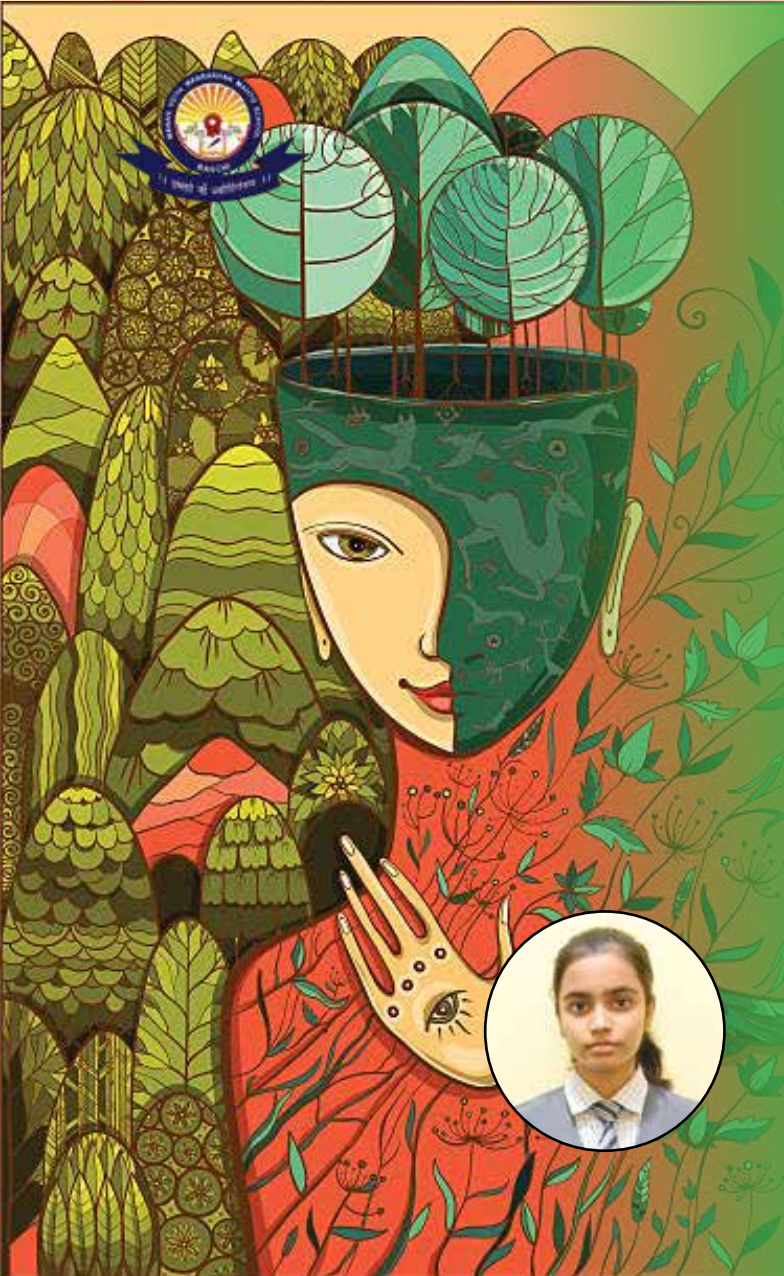
School Days

अध्ययन के लिए उचित वातावरण

यह बहुत आवश्यक है कि माता-पिता के विचारों में समन्वय हो, जिससे उनके बीच हँसी-खुशी का माहौल और परिवार में प्रसन्नता का वातावरण रहे। भाई बहनो के बीच पढ़ाई लिखाई की बातों का आदान-प्रदान होता रहे। एक सुसंस्कृत वातावरण बने और बच्चों को पढ़ाई में मदद मिले। बहुत जरूरी है कि बच्चों को पढ़ाई लिखाई के उचित और आवश्यक सामग्री भी उपलब्ध कराई जाए। अच्छे प्रकाशन की पुस्तकें, कॉपी, पेंसिल, पेन, रबर आदि उन्हें उपलब्ध कराए जाना चाहिए। स्कूल बैग, वॉटर बॉटल, स्कूल ड्रेस आदि का उनकी पढ़ने वाली मानसिकता पर असर पड़ता है। घर में बागवानी, हवादार जगह, एक शांत पढ़ाई का कमरा अत्यंत आवश्यक है यानि कि स्वस्थ वातावरण बहुत जरूरी है।

बाल मन पर मित्रों का बड़ा प्रभाव पड़ता है अतः यह ध्यान देने योग्य है कि मित्र अच्छे संस्कारों वाले मिले जो पढ़ने लिखने वाले हो जिससे

उन्हें मदद मिले। बच्चों के अच्छे स्वास्थ्य के लिए खेलकूद भी अत्यंत आवश्यक है जिसके लिए आवश्यक है कि खेल मैदानी हो जिससे उनका शरीर मजबूत हो क्योंकि स्वस्थ शरीर में ही स्वस्थ मस्तिष्क का वास होता है। कहा भी गया है – ‘शरीरम् खलु धर्म साधनम्’। इसके लिए आवश्यक है बच्चे में पूजा-पाठ और प्रार्थना की प्रवृत्ति जगे। धर्म के प्रति उनमें आस्था हो। इसके लिए बचपन से उनके अंदर भावना जागृत करनी चाहिए।
